If coming from the west, it is the second left after Allen Blvd, on Century Ave (Hwy M) before you go up the hill. Once you turn on Harbor Village Dr, you will see the Cabana straight ahead by the flag pole - you will want to park on the left or if slots are full, you may park on the right in the marked stalls. Since it will be dark, please look for globe lights, Harbor Village's distinguishing feature.
