#### Share your love of textiles and weaving with the public

Our guild has been asked to demonstrate weaving at several area festivals in the fall. Kate Lieber has woven on the Schumacher Farm's house loom at Heritage Fest the past several years and also brought a table loom for children and adults to weave on. This Festival is held in September (usually the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday) in Waunakee and highlights work that would be part of farm life in the 1920s. This includes sausage making, wood cutting skills, chicken rustling, spinning, baking on the wood stove, ice cream making and farm animals. It is a fun place to be in September. There is usually a blue grass band and a free lunch. If you are interested in demonstrating next year let me know.

Emily Nie has volunteered at New Glarus Swiss Harvest Fest in October the past several years and is looking to turn this over to another weaver. This year's fest is Oct 9 (10-4pm). She brings a loom or 2 and lets children weave. We encourage adults too, but they seem self-conscious and defer. The children, both boys and girls (and other gendered) just love it and come back to do more. This fest is held at Swiss Historical Village and features a historical reenactment band, music from the alpenhorns, basket weavers, spinners and you get to see the historical village.

Another volunteer event was having children weave at an evening/late afternoon summer school program at Lindbergh School in Madison. We did this for a few years before the pandemic. We are contacted about these events by the Madison Weaver's guild website and email.

#### Tartan Wool Shawl/Blanket workshop woth Jay Warner.

It's time to start thinking about this year's weaving workshops for the Madison Weavers Guild! This fall we'll be working with wool and tartan plaids with Jay Warner of Hook & Shuttle.

4-shaft, 3-part workshop

This 3 part weaving workshop will guide you through the entire process of creating a beautiful, wool tartan shawl or scarf. Designed for weavers of all levels on a

The kits include all the 2/8 wool yarn needed to create one 18.5x90" shawl on a 3.5 yd warp or two 12x72" scarves on a 5.5 yd warp @ 20 epi. The kit's handout includes patterns/drafts for both the shawl and scarf projects designed around the Highlander Plaid pictured on the first page.

If there is a color you would really like to see included, contact Jay. Do you have a family tartan or would prefer a different pattern? No problem. Jay would be happy to create a custom draft or kit, with other colors for an additional fee. Participants are also welcome to order full pounds of any color. Contact Jay for pricing. All yarns must be ordered by Sept 26 to for delivery by the October 15 meeting. Participants are welcome to use their own yarn but the results may vary.

We are working on securing a meeting place for this workshop. It will be in Madison. Location(s) to be

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

Perhaps you have a new resolution for this year that you will not stock up on yarn, but if you find you need to restock some of your favorites, please consider using our website (<a href="www.madisonweaversguild.com">www.madisonweaversguild.com</a>) if you will order from the Woolery or Halcyon Yarn. Both of these sources return a percentage of your order to our guild. The links are on our resources page. If your item's cost compares favorably on either of these sites please follow the instructions with the logos on the resources page.

**Woolery** discounts and shipping: If you order \$100.01 or more select "Flat Rate" shipping option and your shipping is free (see their website for exceptions). Yarn discounts are \$150 or more and get 10% off or \$300 and get 15% off. If you order enough yarn to get the 10% discount with the free shipping, this is a decent discount.

**Halcyon** sells many kinds of fiber; they have their own signature yarns, high quality heavy rug wools and UKI fiber in many colors. Discounts are available when you buy in quantity. This is place to shop if you are looking for a rich color palette and for yarns that are not available in other shops.
