COLOR GAMPS

Oakwood Village is located on Mineral Point Rd. in Madison. Turn south on Island and take the drive to the left. Go past the Resale Shop and park in the visitor parking. The Westmoreland Room is in the Heritage Oaks Building. There is limited parking in front of the Heritage Oaks building.

Color Gamp Study Project for Fall 2014

After thinking it through we realized that the timing of the color workshop - prep, loom set-up and weaving - will take longer than a 2 day workshop.

We came up with a different idea that allows for more flexibility and a lot less stress. We hope it will attract many participants.

The purpose of this color study is to explore the interaction of colors in warp and weft.

Adding the grey scale will show the values interaction with all the colors. Choosing the right weft can be difficult. Learning about grey tones will help you in finding the right value of the color for your weft.

We will order the yarn and provide weaving instructions. You will set up your own loom, floor or table, and work at home. You can weave at your own speed when time is convenient. You have

a choice of weaving the gamp in plain weave or twill.

Lunatic fringe offers a 12 color kit for 3 projects. We will add white, 5 greys and black. If we order the yarn together we will get a sales discount. Material costs per person are about \$60.00. To cut down on warping and weaving time you can use 5/2 perle cotton set at 18 epi and woven at 18 ppi where or a 10/2 cotton to be set at 24 epi and woven at 24 ppi. At 24 epi make sure you have enough heddles on each shaft.

Time line:

September 15 – Rebecca will present a program on Color at the Guild meeting. You can sign up for the color gamp study project and choose between 5/2 and 10/2 perle cotton. Please be ready to prepay by check for the yarn cost of \$60.00.

October 19 – Yarn pick up at the Guild meeting. If you would like to receive the yarn kit earlier, we will send an email as soon as it is available and where you can pick it up. Bring your color study to the fall meetings for show and tell.

January 19, 2015 – Discussion of Color Gamps at Guild meeting. Prep for next color workshop. Bring your color study projects to share with others. We will look at how the colors interact. Can you find areas with complementary and other combinations, or iridescence?

Follow-up 2 day workshop in color exploration [Jan, Feb or March] Date to be determined later. Round Robin with various color combinations, transition of colors, iridescence, pattern. After the workshop you are encouraged to weave a project of your choice – scarf, placemats, fabric, whatever.

Fall 2015 – sewing workshop to turn fabric into a vest or other garment.
