- Presentation by Linda Alanen

Linda traveled to Norway with a textile tour group from Vesterheim (http://vesterheim.org/) in Decorah, Iowa. She showed slides of Tromso Museum, a Viking longhouse, warp weighted loom with whale bone beater. Fiber items included birch root baskets, lasso from Reindeer leather, fingerweaving, bandweaving, pewter thread, and Sammi costumes.

The group visited the studio of Doris Wicklund, who does tapestry weavings from scenery and flowers. She has written many pattern books, some have been translated to English. 



we know about them.

Two 2 harness rug looms by Union Loom Works. One is model 35; couldn't find model number on the other.

Width of the winders on the looms are 38.5" and 39"; width of the whole looms are 44" and 46"

Each has a spool rack and some shuttles (please see photos attached).

We also have a smaller 21" wide 4 harness loom without a spool rack. We couldn't find the make/model on it.

The union looms are 2 harness and very good for rugs. What she calls spool racks are warping boards. I think.

The table loom is a 4 harness Kessenich. It is a sturdy table loom and a good find.

I would encourage people to see if they can pick them up rather than have them shipped. It is near Rockford in Winnebago, IL.
