
Weaving with Hand Dyed Yarns

WEAVING TIPS AND TRICKS

What do you use to separate your warps on the back beam? I have used the heavy brown paper grocery bags (cut to size) and heavy brown wrapping paper (Staples has nice paper) for many years. Recently I got tired of cutting up bags only to have them wind on quite wonky and risk tension problems. I found some bamboo placemats that I use for felting to be excellent for narrow warps but a pain since they are short and need to be monitored when advancing the warp. So, I went to the hardware store to find bamboo shades or curtains. They were hard to find, but I did find some on sale at Menards. I bought a 36" wide shade for my 18" loom and cut it in half on the chop saw. I carefully pried the hardware off without damaging the sticks. It works great!

page. If your item's cost compares favorably on either of these sites please follow the instructions with the logos on the resources page.

Woolery discounts and shipping: If you order \$100.01 or more select "Flat Rate" shipping option and your shipping is free (see their website for exceptions). Yarn discounts are \$150 or more and get 10% off or \$300 and get 15% off. If you order enough yarn to get the 10% discount with the free shipping, this is decent discount.

Halcyon sells many kinds of fiber; they have their own signature yarns, high quality heavy rug wools and UKI fiber in many colors. Discounts are available when you buy in quantity. This is place to shop if you are looking for a rich color palette and for yarns that are not available in other shops.
