OVERVIEW

BEFORE THE WORKSHOP BEGINS

- 3 drafts & a materials list will be provided via e-mail.
- Participants can attend a Pre-Workshop Zoom Question & Answer session.

WORKSHOP - DAY 1

- Weave deflected double weave samples on your pre-warped 8-shaft loom using various fibers and setts.
- Explore selvedge methods "where the shuttle meets the shed" for beautiful finishing.
- Discuss various finishing methods with and without agitation.
- Cut samples off loom and hand wash samples prior to Day 2.

WORKSHOP - DAY 2

- Discuss and compare hand washed samples-movement/deflection v. differential shrinkage.
- Zoom participants Question & Answer
- Explore a simple treadle OR tie-up change to weave your own scarf with remainder of your warp (or sample).

MATERIALS

- 8 shaft loom
- 2-3 shuttles
- · sample tags
- yarns Zephyr wool & tencel or bamboo in 5/2 or 8/2 (specific information will be emailed to participants.)
- SOAK for washing samples
- a notebook/pen/pencil for draft and samples
